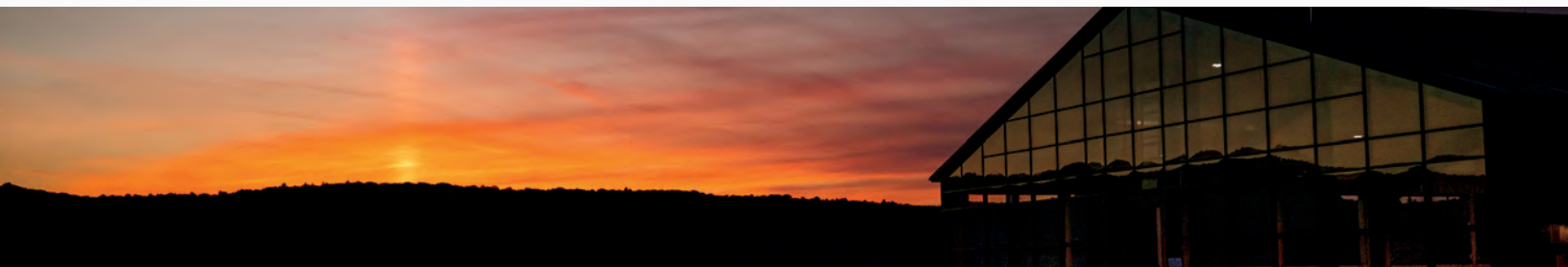
Welcome to the 2025 edition of the Silo Ridge Masters and Highlands Cup!

Horses entered in the International Jumper Division may not enter any national jumper class.

Pre-Vet Inspections: All horses have to be pre-checked by the VD or VSM before entering to the FEI stables and complete the registration of the temperature of the horse for three days before arrival in the Horse App, from the opening of the stables until one hour prior to the horse inspection. The pre-check will be held Tuesday from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, arrivals after hours must be scheduled with the VD.

FEI HorseApp Horse Health Requirements: In accordance with Art. 1029 and 1031 of the FEI 2025 Veterinary Regulations, as of 1 January 2025, ALL Horses competing at ALL FEI Events must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp.

Inspections: All horses will be presented for the veterinary examination & horse inspections as noted in the Definite Schedule in the FEI stabling compound.

Stabling and Schooling: All horses entered in these classes are required to be on grounds AND stabled in the official FEI stable compound for pre inspection prior to the start of their veterinary inspection of the week they are competing. All horses from this point forward are required to wear their assigned back number whenever leaving the official FEI stable compound. Horses may be schooled only during posted schooling times and in designated schooling areas. FEI equipment rules apply. Horse boot and leg inspections will take place with no prior notice to the athlete.

Drug Rules: Conducted under FEI Medication and treating rules and procedures.

ENTRIES: Entries are limited. Entries will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Entries that are mailed in will be recognized upon receipt, not the post-marked date. Also see USEF GR906.1. Entering online is preferred. www.equestrian.digital. Submit Stabling Form separately.

ENTRIES PER DIVISION: 1.40m Jumper = 50 horses; 1.30m Jumper = 50 horses; 1.20m Jumper = 40 horses; 1.10m Jumper = 35 horses; 1.0m Jumper = 25

HORSES: Each competitor is allowed to enter 3 horses in the National Jumper Division. 2 horses in one eligible division and 1 horse in a second eligible division. Horses may only be declared for one division and **may not** cross enter heights. Horses must be declared for their class no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held, except where otherwise stated.

NOMINATION: Nomination fee: \$275

ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible for the Jumper Division horses must be nominated and the nominating fee of \$275 paid by the closing date of entries. Horses nominated after that date must pay a nominating fee of \$375. Once a horse is nominated, he becomes eligible to compete in the following sections: Jumper 1.30m, 1.20m, 1.10m, 1.0m .

RECORDING: The Federation maintains records of winnings in classes at licensed competitions. Jumpers must be recorded with the Federation in order to receive points towards any USEF or USHJA Zone or Horse of the Year awards. Any change of a recorded horses's name and/or ownership must be recorded with Federation in accordance with GR1105 and GR 1107.

TIES: Horses tied for other than first place will be placed based on their time in the first round, unless otherwise stated.

START ORDER: Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule JP 112.

OTHER: Schooling, Tack & Equipment, Conduct & Attire - According to the General Regulations and USEF Rules except where otherwise noted.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Refer to FEI Definite Schedule regarding invitation to compete, FEI entry information, stabling, competition start orders, prize money breakdown and payment and competition fees.

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book and FEI Rules, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. **LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE, COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, ENDURANCE RIDES AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS: (SEE GR828.4 OF THE FEDERATION RULES). LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES**

Federation Entry Agreement - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchip HU104: As of December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration **must provide a microchip number** that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered.

A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785

chip and be implanted in the tenuous ligament of the animal.

This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions. Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

2. ENTRIES:

- Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list. The closing dates for entries will be September 5 or until full.
- Entries in the National Jumper divisions are limited. Riders are allowed to enter 3 horses. Entries will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Entries that are mailed in will be recognized upon receipt, not the postmarked date. See also GR906.1
- Silo Ridge Masters & Highlands Cup requires that nomination fees, stabling fee, and USEF Drug & Admin fee or FEI Drug and Admin fee, Ambulance & Medic Fee \$30, Nightwatch fee \$20 per horse per show & a non refundable Office Processing Fee \$100 accompany each entry blank.
Non Competing Horses will be charged \$250.

Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the **Highlands Horse Shows, Inc.** (a non-profit) in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form for payment of prize money and a USEF Waiver Release form must be signed in order to enter competitions.

Highlands Horse Show Inc. is a New York nonprofit corporation. Highlands Horse Show Inc. is currently awaiting approval of its application for recognition of exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

- Nominations for all non FEI Jumper Sections and classes close September 5, 2025. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$100 unless otherwise stated.
- Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes.
- Late or improper Grand Prix/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 - \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- HOSPITALITY:** All athletes will be charged \$1,000 for two wristbands to the Discovery Land Co. Hospitality Tent per week. Food and beverage will be provided on show days. Competitors who upgrade to a VIP table will receive a credit. The maximum credit per table for hospitality shall be \$3,000 or three hospitality paying riders per table. There are no additional tickets available for purchase in the Discovery Land Co Hospitality Tent.
- NIGHT WATCH:** All horses occupying a stall, whether showing or not, are required to pay a one time per show nightwatch fee of \$20 per show. This.

service is NOT OPTIONAL. Horses will be checked 6 times each night, beginning at 7 pm on Monday through 6 am the following Monday. Please provide emergency contact name and cell phone or hotel room and phone number at your stalls.

- g) Each entry must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers.
- h) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$8 Drug & Medication, \$15 USEF) (FEI horses \$33 fee) and a \$7 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/ USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Failure to present a USEF card will result in having to pay non-member fees. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced.
- i) USEF Eligibility/ USHJA Show Pass Fees:
- USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.
- Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.
- To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.
- The eligibility requirement for foreign participants went into effect on September 1, 2023, and under this requirement, foreign participants are no longer permitted to participate in USEF national competitions by merely demonstrating good standing with their own National Federation. A few important notes on this:
- Foreign Participants will now be required to join USEF as Competing Members.
 - Those individuals 18 years of age and older must take SafeSport Training to be eligible to participate in USEF national competitions.
 - For those participating in FEI events only, this requirement does not apply.
 - This requirement has been in effect since September 1, 2023, for all foreign competitors except Equestrian Canada competitors.
- The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: <https://www.usef.org/show-pass> The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.
- The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: <https://www.usef.org/show-pass> The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.
- j) USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- k) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- l) If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2023 to November 30, 2024. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries.
- m) A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- n) Non competing horses will be charged a fee of \$200 per week.
- o) All horses are required to wear a back number when leaving the stables and on the competition grounds.

4. SCRATCHES:

- a) The Office Processing Fee is non refundable.
- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made in a national

jumper division, once a class has started, the division entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched.

5. STABLING:

- a) Silo Ridge Masters & Highlands have the right to permit horses to come and go at will. We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poling policy.
- b) National stall 10'x10' will be temporary housed under canvas and stall doors will be provided at a fee of \$550 per stall (includes 15 bags of shavings) tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries. A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries.
- FEI stall 10'x12' - **extra tack stalls** will be provided at a fee of \$500 per stall tax included for each FEI competition. Stalls must be reserved by the closing date of entries.
- All tack stalls are limited. Management reserves the right to restrict tack stalls based on availability.
- Free stand stabling on limestone.
- c) Initial bedding **WILL NOT** be provided for FEI stabling.
- d) Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 8:00am the day following the conclusion of each competition.
- e) **STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES**
- f) Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or not, and will be charged accordingly.
- g) No trailering in or working off trailers will be allowed.
- h) Horses are not allowed to share a stall during the competition week. Show accounts may only have a whole stall applied. No splits for the week.
- i) Stables Open Tuesday at 8:00am
6. **COURSES:** In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels.
7. **COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS:** Competition days - Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 4:00 pm whichever is later. Wednesday hours will be from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.
8. **ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT:** All accounts must be settled in full no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary.
- Barn Account Splits will be charged a fee of \$25 per barn. All splits must be completed by 4:00pm on Friday of the current competition week. After that a \$100 fee will be charged and there will be no exceptions.**
9. **PRIZE MONEY:**
- a) All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form in order to receive prize money. Prize money will be credited to entry show account. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.
- b) Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
10. **COMPETITION RING ACCESS:** As posted & weather permitting.
11. **NUMBERS:** All horses when exiting the stable area must wear the number assigned by the show office. Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.
12. **ARENA FOOTING AND DIMENSIONS**

13. **FARRIER:** No farrier other than the official competition farrier will be permitted to shoe on the grounds without the express permission of the Management.
14. **DOGS:** All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Keene Stud show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.

- 15. MEDICAL WASTE:** In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

16. LIABILITY

- a) Highlands Cup Horse Shows, Inc., Morrissey Management Group LLC and Keene Stud and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- b) Highlands Cup Horse Shows, Inc., Morrissey Management Group LLC and Keene Stud and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received / delivered to the show grounds.
- c) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."

- 17. PARKING & GENERAL ADMISSION PASSES:** All vehicles that enter the grounds are required to have a PARKING PASS. A limited amount of passes will be given to each rider upon arrival.

Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Illegally parked vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

General Admission tickets and parking will be charged on Saturday & Sunday Week 1 and Friday, Saturday and Sunday Week 2.

- 18. MOTORIZED VEHICLES:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

19. ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Highlands Cup Horse Shows, Inc. and Morrissey Management Group, LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment.

Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

At all times for horses competing on the Keene Stud grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR839 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR844 (which pertains to Poling), and GR839.4a (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers,

riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Keene Stud grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed:

20. POLING AND OFF-SETS:

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Keene Stud grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

21. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS:

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to three lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four (24) hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's and/or Technical Delegate's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

22. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

23. USEF SAFE SPORT STATEMENT:

Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 



B. **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK:** I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (“**Risks**”).

WARNING:

HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK. Under the laws New York, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional may not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities. C. **ASSUMPTION OF RISK:** I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. **WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY:** In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the “Released Parties” or “Event Organizers”**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature (“**Liability**”) which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. **COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE:** This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

By signing below, that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time, as well as all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If, despite this Agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf or the minor’s behalf, makes a claim for Liability against any of the Released Parties, I will indemnify, defend and hold harmless each of the Released Parties from any such Liabilities as the result of such claim.
